Two solar eclipses are coming to North America – an Annular Eclipse on October 14, 2023 and a Total Solar Eclipse on April 8, 2024. A grant from the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation and a supplement to the NASA @ My Library Project has allowed the Space Science Institute's STAR Net team to provide a limited number of solar viewing glasses to public libraries. To receive your solar viewing glasses (while supplies last) from OCLS, you must attend a program related to the upcoming eclipses.
