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NEA Big Read 2023 kicks off at Orange County Library System

OCLS hosts programs featuring Ross Gay's poetry collection, Catalog of Unabashed Gratitude



[Orlando, Florida — March 15, 2023] Orange County Library System launches its National Endowment for the Arts Big Read program on Sunday, April 2, 2023 at 2 p.m. This year, OCLS, in partnership with Valencia College, highlights *Catalog of Unabashed Gratitude*, a collection by poet and author Ross Gay, who will deliver a keynote at the kickoff event on April 2.

Orange County Library System is one of 62 not-for-profit organizations to receive a grant to host an NEA Big Read project between 2022-2023. Showcasing a diverse range of contemporary titles that reflect many different voices and perspectives, the NEA Big Read aims to inspire conversation and discovery. Orange County Library System has chosen to celebrate Ross Gay's poetry collection, *Catalog of Unabashed Gratitude*. Events highlighting the message of meditation and joy found in *Catalog of Unabashed Gratitude* will take place at all 15 library locations between April 2–30, 2023.

Ross Gay is the author of four books of poetry: *Against Which; Bringing the Shovel Down; Be Holding,* winner of the PEN American Literary Jean Stein Award; and *Catalog of Unabashed Gratitude,* winner of the 2015 National Book Critics Circle Award and the 2016 Kingsley Tufts Poetry Award. His first collection of essays from 2019, *The Book of Delights,* was a New York Times bestseller. *Inciting Joy,* his newest collection of essays, was released by Algonquin in October of 2022.

Registration for the <u>keynote/kickoff event with Ross Gay</u> at Orlando Public Library on April 2 is not required to attend. Guests that register will receive a copy of the book *Catalog of Unabashed Gratitude*.
