Orange County Library System awarded \$5,000 grant from Duke Energy Foundation

ORLANDO, FL – Orange County Library System (OCLS) is one of 22 organizations in Florida to collectively receive \$641,000 in grants from the Duke Energy Foundation. The library was awarded \$5,000 for its Summer Reading Program, distributing age-appropriate books to combat summer learning loss in low-income children and providing outreach and support to childcare organizations in four Orange County communities.

OCLS is one of nine Central Florida STEM programs to receive the grant which will be used for programming during its Summer Reading Program this year. Other organizations in Central Florida to receive the grant include the Foundation for Orange County Public Schools, Orlando Science Center, HAPCO Music Foundation and The Foundation for Seminole County Public Schools.
