# Celebrate Pride Month, Juneteenth and the Summer Reading Program at the Library

Join Orange County Library System in a celebration of culture for Pride Month. During June, we amplify voices and recognize the contributions that courageous people of the LGBTQIA+ community have made to the world. The library will host to a rainbow of events for all ages, from readings and talks like <u>I Am a Queer Man</u> that explore and the experiences of LGBTQIA+ people, to art events and concerts like the <u>Chamber Ensembles from the Central</u> Florida Sounds of Freedom. This month OCLS also celebrates the significance of Juneteenth, the day in 1865 that emancipated slaves living in Galveston, Texas learned they were free. Juneteenth has been observed by African American communities since 1866, and officially became a federal holiday on June 17, 2021. Events like A Black Girl's Reflections of Love and Resilience, an artistic journey through the history of Juneteenth by actress and songstress Patrece Bloomfield, will highlight Black history, love and joy.
