Juneteenth honors the historic day in 1865 that enslaved people living in Galveston, Texas learned they had been emancipated. Juneteenth has been observed by African American communities since 1866, and officially became a federal holiday on June 17, 2021. Events highlighting and celebrating Black history, love and joy will take place throughout the month of June, including a discussion by human rights lawyer and artist <a href="Lauren Austin of That Black Girl Art">Lauren Austin of That Black Girl Art</a> and concerts by Grammy-nominated artist <a href="Fyütch">Fyütch</a>.
